Cold and influenza (flu) season in the Midwest is in full swing. Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. Symptoms include cough, sore throat, runny/stuffy nose, headache, body or muscle aches, fatigue/tiredness. Not everyone with the flu will have a fever.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) offer the following proper precautions to keep you and your families healthy:

- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds before leaving home, on arrival at school/work, after using the restroom, before food preparation, before eating any food (including snacks), and when arriving back at home.
 - For young children, suggest they hum the "Happy Birthday" song twice from beginning to end twice
 while washing their hands. This video (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eZw4Ga3jg3E) from the
 CDC is a great resource to show young children.
 - o If soap is unavailable, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Rub the sanitizer over all the surfaces of your hands, which also takes approximately 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough/sneeze with a tissue, throw the tissue in the garbage, and wash your hands. If a tissue is unavailable, cough/sneeze into your flexed elbow.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Avoid close contact with anyone who is sick.
- Stay home if you are sick. Do not send your student to school if they are feeling sick. See "When to Stay Home from Work or School" for more information.
- Influenza vaccinations are still available, which you can obtain through your student's health care provider or at Grand Forks Public Health (Tuesday/Thursday/Friday by appointment please call 701-787-8100).

The flu season has been complicated by a cluster of respiratory illnesses caused by the novel *coronavirus (COVID-19)*. Recent reports in the media have increased awareness and concern. We are planning and continuing to work with state and local entities on receiving information through regular updates as this evolves.

We want to provide you with some basic, but important, facts regarding the novel coronavirus:

- It was first identified in the city of Wuhan in Hubei Province in China.
- The North Dakota Department of Health has provided information to healthcare providers to rapidly identify any possible cases.

Manyel Public Schools is taking a number of precautions, which include:

- Promoting and reinforcing proper handwashing, which will include hanging posters by hand washing sinks,
- Having hand sanitizer widely available throughout our school
- Checking our cleaning product inventory and purchasing additional materials as needed
- Custodial teams increasing sanitization of high-contact surfaces
- We will also monitor absentee patterns
